For non-emergency personnel Keep unnecessary personnel away. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Provide maximum ventilation, especially in low places where heavy vapors might collect. Observe precautions from other sections.

6.3. Methods and material for containment and cleaning up Soak up with inert absorbent material.

Large Spills: Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Cover with plastic sheet to prevent spreading. Clean contaminated surface thoroughly. Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Following product recovery, flush area with water.

Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination.

Never return spills in original containers for re-use. Clean up spills immediately, observing precautions in Protective Equipment section. Sweep up and shovel into suitable containers for disposal.
